TED CRUZ ENDORSED BY MAJORITY OF SREC MEMBERS ACROSS TEXAS

AUSTIN, Texas—Former Texas Solicitor General Ted Cruz announced Monday that his campaign for Texas Attorney General has been endorsed by a majority of elected members of the State Republican Executive Committee (SREC) from across Texas.

The SREC works actively to elect Republican candidates, reach out to new voters, and strengthen the party. The organization, comprised of one committeewoman and committeeman from each state senate district, represents millions of Republican voters throughout Texas. 34 SREC members are backing Cruz's campaign to date.

"I'm honored and humbled to have the support of so many hard working Republican leaders throughout the State of Texas," Cruz said. "The momentum we're building is remarkable, and deeply encouraging. We're witnessing an awakening—Texans are profoundly hungry for leaders who will stand up and fight for economic liberty and Texas values."

The new endorsements come on the heels of last month's announcement that a majority of Texas Federation of Republican Women (TFRW) statewide elected officers are backing Cruz's campaign, and earlier this summer, the endorsement of over two dozen statewide and national grassroots leaders. In addition, Cruz has raised more than \$1.1 million and has received contributions from some 800 donors and 111 cities across Texas.

Cruz filed to run for Attorney General in January 2009, should Attorney General Greg Abbott not seek re-election.

For the past nine months, Cruz has campaigned across every region of the State. At each event across Texas, the campaign has gained endorsements, volunteer sign-ups, and new financial contributors.
